

Professionalism and Comraderie

Assistant principals play a very critical role in creating school culture, supportive of student learning and professional growth for all members in our school communities. While each school and the community it serves are unique, there are common themes that emerge when we come

together to share our stories. We are all serving urban populations where the issues of equity and low student achievement are the most common topics, and so are parental involvement, staff attrition, poor attendance and general lack of resources.

The concerns for student achievement, more often than not, collide with the manifestations of urban poverty, which can be obvious, such as inadequate access to services and resources, or more subtle, such as fixed mindset and low expectations. The urgency with which these issues must be addressed, to a large degree, define the work of assistant principals in urban settings and can potentially make us feel isolated.

The Association of Assistant Principals can definitely help us address the isolation issue, but also provides us with a lot more than opportunities to connect, exchange ideas and support each other. AAP has created a "small" community within a huge urban system, a community that crosses borough and district borders. The community that includes diverse points of views, various levels of expertise and countless professional interests. For the new supervisors, AAP is a great launching pad to a long, rewarding career. For more experienced administrators, AAP represents rejuvenation and professional nourishment for our collective journey towards assuring that all of our pupils have a chance to succeed, and our staff has opportunities to grow and lead us towards a better future.

Thank you to the Association of Assistant Principals for selecting this wonderful venue. It was a great way to shake the day's stress away.




